Police Departments Dealing With Surge In Police Suicides

The [Washington Times](#)   (10/17, Kaplan) reports that a “a surge” in law enforcer suicides is “prompting police departments to address concerns about the mental health of their members.” Psychologists and police officials say that officers’ stressors include “increased scrutiny, mandatory overtime, perceived hostility and physical danger,” as well as schedules that “often don’t promote

healthy habits.” Terrence Cunningham, deputy executive director of the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP), “compared the stress that officers experience to carrying a heavy load without assistance. ‘It’s like putting bricks in a backpack and at some point the backpack gets too heavy and it needs help,’ said Mr. Cunningham, a former police chief in Wellesley, Massachusetts.” Cunningham “said ‘people are finally starting to realize we have got to knock down the stigma and change the entire culture. The whole profession has to be healthier.’”

RE: 2020 Carl Moller Scholarship Program (**New Scholarship Program**)

At the April 2020 CPCA EXPO, the Connecticut Police Foundation will award **\$1,000** college scholarships to two deserving high school students in Connecticut who want to pursue a career in law enforcement.

We would like you to participate actively in the process of selecting the winners. We are asking you to:

1. Announce the scholarship program in your police department and in your school district.
2. Post details of the scholarship program on your department or school bulletin board or email to members of your department. The information can be downloaded from the CPCA website, **www.cpcanet.org**.
3. Police Chiefs - Collect, review, and evaluate scholarship applications from the students in your town, evaluate them, and recommend the most deserving applicant (**one only**) from your jurisdiction.
4. Forward the application you select to the Awards Committee **by February 15, 2020** for final determination of the 2020 scholarship winners by the Connecticut Police Foundation Carl Moller Scholarship Committee.

In recommending high school students from your jurisdiction you should consider financial need and the candidate's dedication to a career in law enforcement. **Applications cannot be accepted without the written recommendation of the Police Chief in the town where the student lives or attends high school.**

To provide general information about the scholarship for you we are attaching general information, an application form, and a financial aid form. Please duplicate these forms to make them available to interested students.

Remember: The application of your nominee with your recommendation and signature must be submitted before **February 15, 2020**. Thank you for your help.

SCHOLARSHIPS: Two \$1,000 Scholarships per year

DEADLINE: Submit to your local police chief by **January 1, 2020**

APPLICANT REQUIREMENTS:

1. Must be in the senior year of study and currently enrolled in an accredited high school program in Connecticut.
2. Must be applying for admission to a degree program at an accredited post-secondary institution of higher learning.
3. Must be in need of financial aid and without such aid would find it difficult although not necessarily impossible to obtain education.
4. Must submit properly completed forms and letters to his/her police chief by **January 1, 2020**.

AWARD STIPULATION:

1. Awards to be used for tuition, fees, texts, supplies and other necessary academic purposes.
2. Awards conditioned upon substantiation of admission and expenses.
3. A check for \$1,000 to be given to each winner following submission of appropriate documents.

BASIS OF SELECTING WINNERS:

1. Each police chief in Connecticut will select one applicant from those submitted in his department and send the applicant's completed forms to the Connecticut Police Foundation by **February 15, 2020**.
2. Scholarship winners will then be selected by the Foundation's Awards Committee.
3. Winners will be selected on the basis of financial need and dedication to a career in law enforcement.
4. Winners will be announced in March.
5. **Actual award will be made in April each year at the CPCA Annual EXPO.**
